THIS NATIONAL PARK IS AN EXTRAORDINARY PLACE

This relatively small area hosts a great diversity of volcanic structures and materials. This is one of the reasons why it's included in the UNESCO list of World Heritage Sites.

In addition, its location on an island and its high mountain climate means that unique, rare, and fragile animals and plants live here.




A WILD BUT DELICATE TERRITORY

Teide National Park receives more than four million visitors each year, making it one of the most visited parks in Spain. This means that, on occasion, the number of vehicles is excessive.

Furthermore, due to the steep terrain, the roads are narrow, have no hard shoulders, there are bends with no visibility and there are few parking spaces.

Showing responsibility, both behind the wheel and at your stops makes the experience more enjoyable for you and other visitors.

WHAT IF YOU LET YOURSELF BE TAKEN TO MOUNT TEIDE?

Travelling by public transport benefits you, the island, and the planet.

If you choose to leave your car for a day and visit Mount Teide by bus, there are two bus lines that go up to the national park first thing in the morning and return in the afternoon to their points of origin:

Town of La Orotava. It offers
a simulated ascent from the
seashore to the summit of Mount
Teide, travelling virtually along
the same path that Humboldt,
the famous German naturalist,
followed in 1799. Next to the
centre, there is a native flora
garden, with species from the
different vegetation levels of the
island of Tenerife.

THE ROCK FORTRESS THAT GUARDS AN ANCESTRAL CULTURE

The ancient volcanoes of the Teno Massif have been carved out by millions of years of erosion, forming a striking landscape of ravines and cliffs. An agricultural culture of enormous ethnographic interest has developed in this difficult terrain.



You can contribute to the maintenance of this area by behaving in a way that respects the environment and its inhabitants, as well as buying a variety of local products.

ROADS WINDING THROUGH SPECTACULAR SCENERY

Teno Rural Park is characterised by its rugged terrain. The roads that run through it are adapted to this terrain, and are often narrow, with no hard shoulder, steep slopes and bends with poor visibility. Because of its beauty, it is a very popular area, but parking is scarce, which sometimes leads to a build-up of traffic.

TWO PARTICULAR ENCLAVES

In order to offer a quality visit and safeguard the values of the most visited points in the rural park, specific regulations have been put in place:

HAMLET OF MASCA

As parking is limited, it is not permitted to park for a long period of time. For hiking, you must reach Masca by public transport.

PUNTA DE TENO

For security and conservation reasons, access by private or hire car is restricted. You must park in Buenavista and take public transport.

LOS PEDREGALES VISITORS' CENTRE

This visitors' centre is located in the valley of El Palmar, where you can ask any questions you may have, and receive recommendations on routes and places to discover, as well as the cultural and gastronomic offer of the Rural Park.

You can contribute to the maintenance of this area by behaving in a way that respects the environment, inhabitants, as well as buy its varied local products.




AN INTRICATE LANDSCAPE RISING FROM THE SEA

The ruggedness of the landscape is part of the beauty of Anaga Parque Rural. The roads are moulded to the terrain and are often narrow, with no hard shoulder and low-visibility bends.





Its natural and cultural values make it an enticing place to visit. But parking is scarce. For this reason, you may find heavy traffic in certain places.



SPECIAL ENCLAVES

Due to the high demand but scarce parking, we recommend that you access these places by public transport:

CRUZ DEL CARMEN

The Anaga Visitors' Centre and the start of several trails are located here. Please do not park for hours at a time and leave verges and turning areas free.

ALMÁCIGA, ROQUE DE LAS BODEGAS AND BENIJO BEACHES

These are beaches of great beauty, but dangerous. Always leave the way clear and the areas reserved for ambulances and public transport.
